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FCA Canada: Sixteen-Year-Old Rookie Dodge Driver Cayden Lapcevich Wins NASCAR Pinty's Series Title

- Canadian Cayden Lapcevich is now youngest champion ever in any NASCAR national or touring series
- Andrew Ranger, the official driver of the #27 Team Mopar car, finished 2016 season strong, second in points

September 20, 2016, Windsor, Ontario - Rookie Dodge driver Cayden Lapcevich, age 16, has become the youngest person ever to win a NASCAR national or touring series, claiming the Driver's Title in Canada's NASCAR Pinty's Series this past weekend.

The Grimsby, Ontario, teenager won the series title after taking the green flag at Sunday's Kawartha 250 at Kawartha Speedway in Fraserville, Ontario. Lapcevich, who initially planned to compete only part-time this season, finished the year with three wins and was the only driver to finish in the Top 10 in all 12 events. He claims the title of youngest champion in NASCAR from former Daytona 500 winner Joey Logano.

As with the majority of the full-time 2016 NASCAR Pinty's Series competitors, Lapcevich crossed the finish line at Kawartha Speedway at the wheel of a Dodge Challenger-bodied racing car. More than half of the races this season were won by a Dodge driver, with over half of the Top 20 final points positions held by Dodge drivers.

Andrew Ranger, the fan-favourite driver for Team Mopar, closed out the 2016 season strong, second in the overall Pinty's Series points after finishing in 14th place at Kawartha. The Roxton Pond, Quebec, native drove the #27 Mopar Parts Dodge to two wins and nine Top 10 finishes this season. Ranger has won the series championship twice previously.

"We want to congratulate both Cayden and Andrew on very successful seasons," said Jim Kiritsis, Senior Manager, National Service and Parts for Mopar Canada. "Cayden has a bright future ahead and Andrew continues to drive home very strong results as our official #27 Mopar wheelman. FCA Canada's support of the NASCAR Pinty's Series, through its Mopar, Dodge and Ram brands, continues to be a perfect conduit for us to connect with Canada's dedicated motorsport fans."

FCA has been an integral part of the NASCAR series in Canada since their inception in 2007 and even traces its support back to the former CASCAR Series. Dodge was again at the forefront this season as the official car of the series and again provided the official pace car – a 2016 Dodge Charger SRT Hellcat – alongside a Dodge Grand Caravan for track-side promotional efforts. The Ram Truck brand supplied a Ram 1500 and 3500 as safety vehicles.

As in the past nine seasons, contingency funds were offered for the Dodge/Mopar Quick Three and Dodge/Mopar-powered Quick Three. Awarded after each race, they recognize the fastest drivers in Dodge-bodied cars and those

using a proven, race-winning Mopar 5.9-litre V-8 under hood. At the Pinty's 250 at Kawartha Speedway, Lapcevich received the Dodge award and Ranger the Mopar-powered award.
